Adobe Flash uses a programming language called ActionScript, enabling us to create highly interactive, multimedia-based websites, product demos, learning materials, and much, much more. Since both ActionScript and JavaScript are based on the same ECMA Script syntax, fluency in one easily translates to the other. However, the client model is dramatically different: while JavaScript deals with windows, documents and forms, ActionScript deals with movie-clips, text fields and sounds. This course will not only guide you, step by step through projects that explain not only what is happening, but why and how.
